

Pendant with beads

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Materials and equipment:

Size 20 thread, 44 size 9 or 11 beads, a pendant Bail, a chain necklace, a Big Eyed or fine needle and sewing thread to string the beads and the usual tatting equipment.

Abbreviations:

R. = Ring, B = bead, p = picot, cl = close ring, RW = reverse work, CH. = chain, tension = pull up or spread out the stitches to match the curve in the sample, + = join.



String 47 beads then wind about 3 metres on your shuttle with 6 of the Beads leaving the rest of the beads on the ball thread. Do not cut.

- R.A Bring 3 beads into the ring round your hand then:
4, p, 4, 3B (make the picot that holds the beads big enough to hold 4 beads to allow room for the joins later in the pattern) 8, cl
- R.B Bring 3 beads into the ring round your hand then:
8, 3B (make the picot that holds the beads big enough to hold 4 beads to allow room for the joins later in the pattern) 4, p, 4, cl. RW
- CH. 3, B, 3, 3B, 3, B, 3, tension
- R.C 6, + to ring B, 6, cl,
- R.D 6, p, 6, cl, RW
- CH. 3, B, 3, 3B, 3, B, 3, tension
- R.E 4, + to ring D, 4, make a join to the beaded picot on ring B so that there is one bead to the left of the join and two beads on the right of the join,
4, p, 4, cl, RW
- CH. Move up one bead on the ball thread
3, B, 3, 3B, 3, B, 3, tension

- R.F 6, + to ring E, 6, cl,
- R.G 6, p, 6, cl, RW
- CH. 3, B, 3, 3B, 3, B, 3, tension

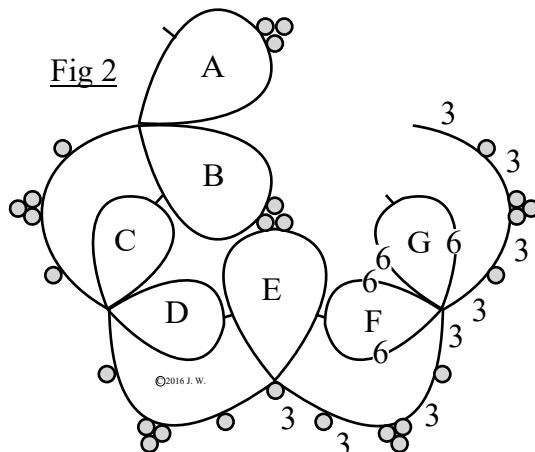
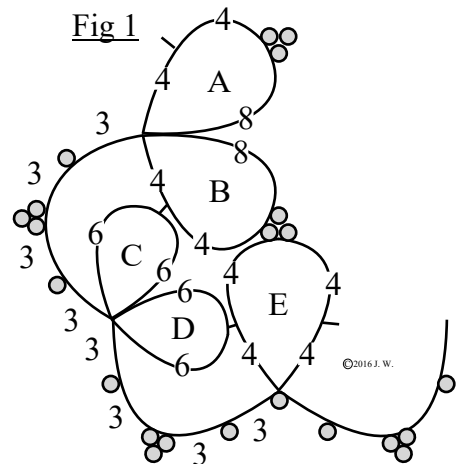

- R.H 4, + to ring G, 4, + between the two beads on the beaded picot on ring B, 8, cl,
R.I 8, + to the beaded picot on ring A so that there is one bead to the left of the join and two beads to the right, 4, p, 4, cl, RW
CH. 3, B, 3, 3B, 3, B, 3, tension as before,
R.J 6, + to ring I, 6, cl,
R.K 6, p, 6, cl, RW
CH. 3, B, 3, 3B, 3, B, 2, + to the necklace bail, 1 tension as before
R.L 4, + to ring K, 4, + between the two beads on the beaded picot on ring A, 4, p, 4, cl, RW
CH 1, + to the necklace bail again, 2, B, 3, 3B, 3, B, 3, tension as before

- R.M 6, + to ring L, 6, cl,
R.N 6, + to ring A, 6, cl, RW
CH. 3, B, 3, 3B, 3, B, 3

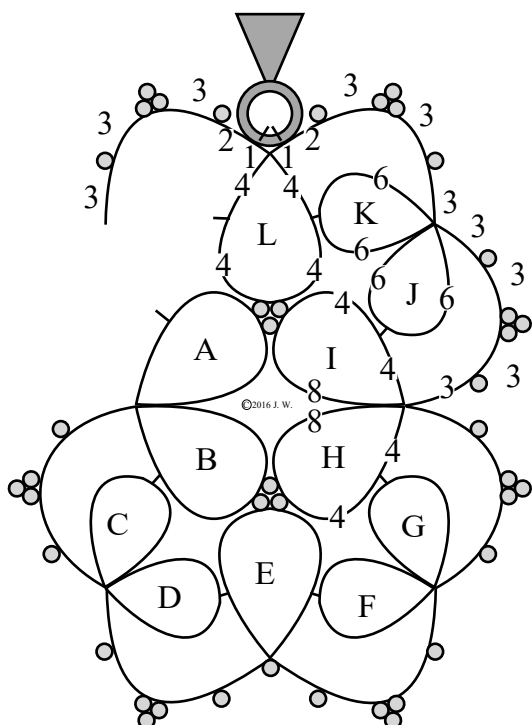
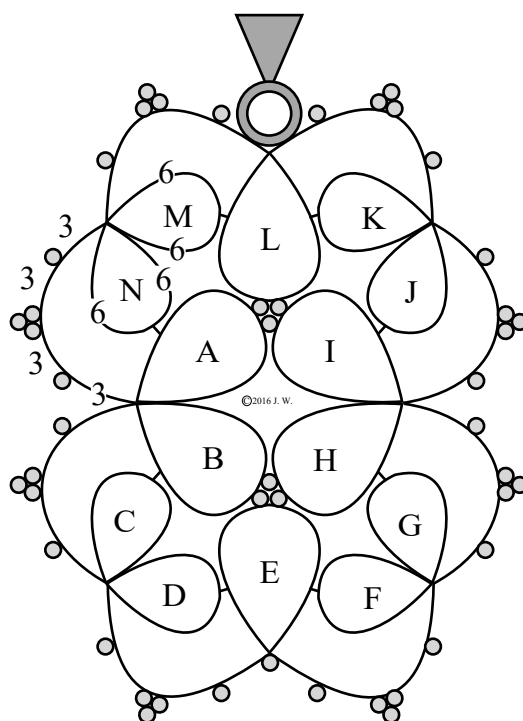

- Cut and tie to the base of rings A and B.
- Secure the ends.
- Block and stiffen.
- Slip a necklace chain through the bail.
