

Celtic Tatting project 1

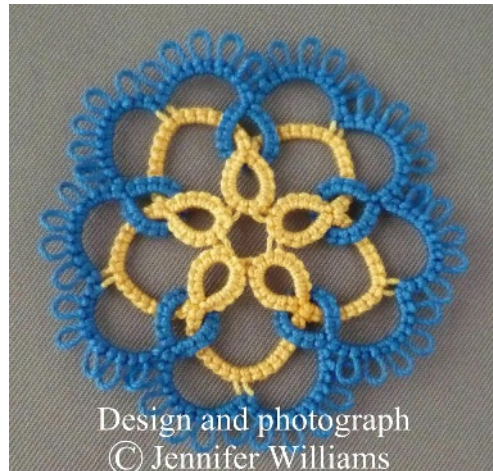
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Materials and equipment:

Size 20 thread, 2 shuttles, a Celtic and an ordinary one and the usual tatting equipment.

Abbreviations:

R. = ring, ds = double stitch, cl = close ring,
RW = reverse work, CH. = chain, p = picot,
+ = join, sj = shuttle join



Row 1

Wind approximately 1 ½ metres on your shuttle.

Do not cut

R.A 6, p, 2, p, 6, cl, RW

CH. 8, p, 8, RW

*R.B 6, + to previous ring, 2, p, 6, cl, RW

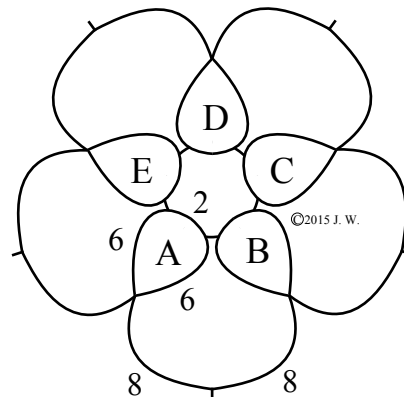
CH. 8, p, 8, RW

Repeat from * twice more then

R.E 6, + to previous ring, 2, + to ring 'A', 6, cl, RW

CH. 8, p, 8

Cut and tie to base of ring 'A' then secure the ends.



Row 2

Wind about 1 ½ metres on the Celtic shuttle.

Do not cut.

R.F 15 ds round the base of ring 'A' on row '1', cl, RW

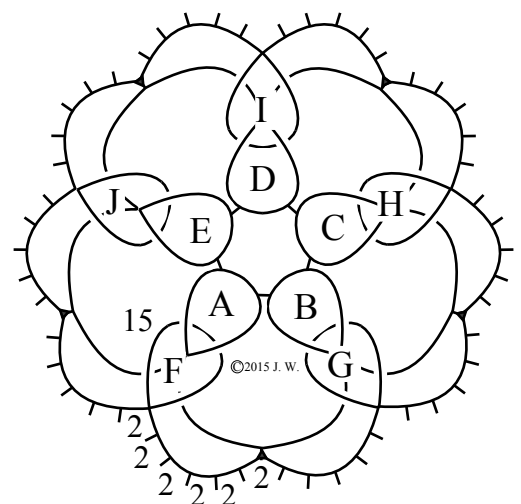
CH. 2, (p, 2) x 5, sj to the chain between rings 'A' and 'B' of row '1', 2, (p, 2) x 5, RW

*R.G 15 ds round the base of the adjacent ring on row '1', cl, RW

CH. 2, (p, 2) x 5, sj to the chain between rings 'A' and 'B' of row '1', 2, (p, 2) x 5, RW

Repeat from * three more times.

Cut and tie to the base of ring 'F' then secure the ends.

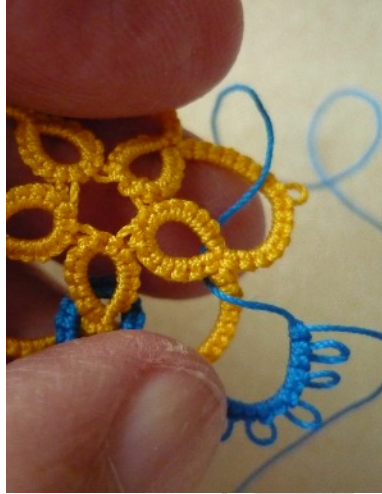


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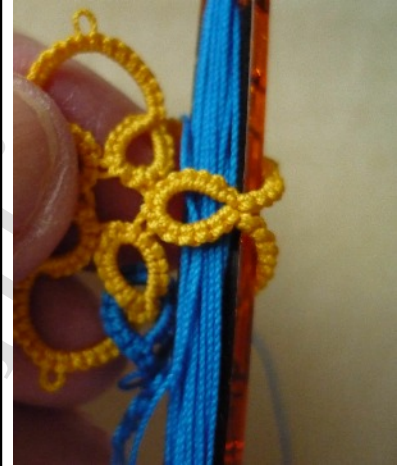
Take the shuttle behind the base of the ring on the previous row.



Pull the shuttle right through



Take the shuttle through the same 'path' again.



Pull the shuttle right through again



Pull the threads until the chain follows the same path.



Tat the number of stitches in the ring, following the pattern.



Pull the chain and part of the ring back through at the base of the ring of the previous row.



Close the ring and continue, following the pattern
