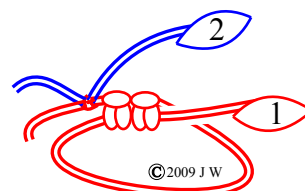


Daisy Picot Technique

To work a 'daisy picot' wind two shuttles with a different colour on each. In the diagrams below 'shuttle 1' is wound with red thread and 'shuttle 2' is wound with blue thread. Knot the threads together.

Using shuttle 1 (red) round your hand to make a ring work 2 double stitches.

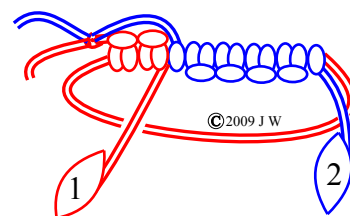


Let shuttle 1 (red) hang down at the front of your work and take up shuttle 2 (blue).

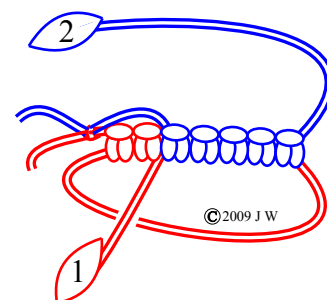
Reverse tat (the stitches are not turned) double stitches starting with the 1st half of the stitch.

In the diagram there are 5 double stitches - reverse tatted.

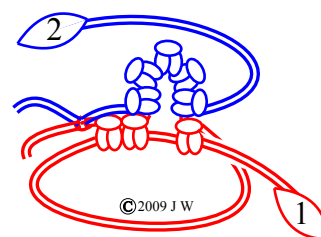
At this stage the heads of the stitches will be facing downwards.



Lay shuttle 2 (blue) over the back of your hand and turn the stitches upwards so that the 'heads' are facing the right way



Pick up shuttle 1 (red) and work a (turned) double stitch.



You now have double stitches on a picot.
