






R.D 6, + to the adjacent hole in the button, 6, cl, RW (Fig 5)  
 CH.2 2, p, 2, bridging chain to vsp on the previous chain and work 5, p, 5, back along the thread, 2, p, 2, RW (Fig 6)



Work 4 more 'petals' by repeating from ring 'C' and at the same time joining adjacent rings from the 'trumpet' when working rings E, G, I and K.

Join 3 rings into each of the 4 holes in the button.

The red picots in Fig 7 indicate when a picot from the 'trumpet' is to be added



### Adding stamens

Cut a length (about 14 inches/35 cm) of sewing thread, fold in half and thread the two cut ends onto a 'big eyed' needle.

Take the needle up through one of the holes in the button (leaving a tail about 3 inches/8 cm), through a bugle bead and a small bead then back through the bugle bead and one of the other holes in the button. Pull up the thread to bring the bugle bead right inside the trumpet.

Take the needle up through an adjacent hole in the button and add a bugle bead and small bead as before. Repeat the above adding as many stamen as you like - 3 to 5 should be about right.

Tie the ends and secure them.

### Assembling the brooch

Cut a length of the tatting thread, fold it in half and thread cut ends onto a needle. Attach the thread to a brooch back then sew to the back of the daffodil.
